



Touching torch moments

There have been many magic moments as the Olympic Torch Relay passed through communities throughout Australia. In Adelaide the route passed directly along Percy Street, Prospect - where RM Williams established his company and which today houses a retail store and the company's Outback Heritage Museum.
